## **MUSEUM ENTRANCE & OFFICES MOVE**

The Byron Museum is pleased to announce it has recently moved its offices to the 110 N. Union entrance. While still in the museum complex, the offices and entrance will be where the Byron Chamber of Commerce was previously. The former office area will now be a gallery space for temporary exhibits. A number of other moving and remodeling changes are planned for the next several months. "We are very excited about the changes that are coming. They will create a more inviting space for our visitors," said Jessica McCanse, Executive Director. "We want the Museum to be inviting for not only our regular visitors, but also for those people who come to see the Smithsonian's traveling exhibit, Between Fences." Some other changes that have, or will occur include, the museum's library which is now located in the former director's office. Two interior walls of the former library will be torn down to make the exhibition hall more open. The newly created gallery space will give the museum, an opportunity to host additional traveling and temporary exhibits throughout the year, and will soon be opening a new traveling exhibition of World War II Posters. Our goal is to help the museum bring new and exciting exhibits to the community, and make the museum a comfortable, engaging learning place for all of our visitors.



# WORLD WAR TWO PROPOGANDA POSTER EXHIBIT OPEN HOUSE MAY 30TH

The Byron Museum announces the inauguration of its new gallery with a special traveling exhibition highlighting United States Government issued propaganda posters from World War Two. The exhibit, opening May 30th, features nine original posters printed by the United States Government, which was actively involved in propaganda efforts to encourage citizens to support the

war in Europe and Asia. Posters played a vital role in this effort.

"We have been collecting artifacts and stories of area veterans for the past several years, so, this is a great opportunity for us to highlight some of our collection partnering with some very poignant images from


